Hurlburt Chapter Supports Wreaths Across America

Each December on National Wreaths Across America Day, the mission to Remember, Honor and Teach is carried out by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at more than 4,225 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea and abroad. Anyone who wants to offer a small gesture of gratitude for the freedoms Americans enjoy can volunteer at a wreath laying ceremony to assist in saying veteran names aloud and thanking them for their service.

Volunteers across the nation play a valuable role by placing live, balsam veterans' wreaths on the headstones of our fallen heroes. For centuries, fresh evergreens have been used as a symbol of honor and have served as a living tribute renewed annually.

Wreaths Across America believes the tradition represents a living memorial that honors veterans, active-duty military, and their families. When each wreath is placed the servicemember's name is said out loud, ensuring their memory lives on.

This year's Wreaths Across America Day took place on December 14, 2024. On that day, more than 2 million Veterans' Wreaths were be placed across Local, National and Military Cemeteries as well as Veterans' Memorials and historic sites.

At each of those sites, a Wreaths Across America Location Coordinators worked throughout the year to organize and promote the ceremony, coordinate wreath delivery and manage the placement of wreaths. In addition to location coordinators, most Wreaths Across America locations rely on the assistance of community members, local businesses and civic groups and organizations to place wreaths on the day of the event

This year as in years past Chapter 398 members once again participated in the laying and collecting of wreaths at the Beale Memorial Cemetery in Fort Walton Beach.



Chapter Member Speaks at Leadership Conference

Colonel Joe Kinego, USAF (Ret), and the Pensacola Representative Vice President for AFA Hurlburt Chapter 398, was asked to speak at the 12th Flying Training Wing Leadership Conference which was held at Pensacola Naval Air Station. The 12th FTW is headquartered at Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph in San Antonio, TX, and consists of the 12th Operations Group which conducts Instructor Pilot Training at Randolph AFB, TX, the 479th Flying Training Group located at NAS Pensacola, FL, and is responsible for conducting all Air Force Undergraduate Combat Systems Officer Training, and the 306th Flying Training Group located at the United States Air Force Academy, CO, and conducts powered flight training, soaring, and parachute training for the Air Force Academy cadets.



Specifically, Col Kinego was asked to discuss operational risk management (risk assessment and mitigation). As examples he used his RF-4C pilot experience in Vietnam and discussed how RF-4 crews assessed and mitigated operational risks during their day/night combat missions in Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia, his SR-71 experiences as an SR-71 pilot and squadron commander to discuss risk assessment and mitigation measures the SR-71 Blackbird community used to conduct operational Cold War reconnaissance missions primarily targeting the Soviet Union, China, North Korea, North Vietnam, and Cuba, and his experiences as a B-1B wing Director for Operations, Vice Commander, and Commander to discuss the challenges the B-1B program faced fielding a new weapon system and preparing B-1B aircrews, maintenance personnel, and the whole wing and base infrastructure for a nuclear commitment in support of the Cold War and The Strategic Air Command's SIOP commitment.

Following each aircraft example during his presentation, a group discussion was held to look at how those examples would be looked at and evaluated using the current Air Force Operational Risk Management direction in the Department of the Air Force Pamphlet (DAFPAM) 90-803. The overall response to Col Kinego's briefing and the follow-on discussions was excellent.

Unsung Heroes

The 1st Special Operations Wing has appointed MSgt Juan Santiago, 1 Special Operations Squadron 1st Sgt, as the POC for the Unsung Hero Program. Max Friedauer, founder and Chapter lead for the Unsung Heroes Program met with MSgt Santiago as he finalizes his team to select this year's recipients. Currently the recognition ceremony is tentatively set for Mid-March and plans for the ceremony are for it to be at the Soundside Club on Hurlburt Field. The Wing Commander and Command Chief are available at that time and look forward to attending the Luncheon
