The luncheon was held at the main ballroom at the Soundside Club on Hurlburt Field, Fl. Over 125 people: active duty, retired and civilian gathered for lunch and to hear Lt Gen Webb



speak. In the audience were two former AFSOC Commanders, two past vice commanders, three previous AFSOC Directors of Operations, two retired Directors of Logistics and two retired AFSOC Command Chiefs. Lt Gen Webb spoke about how proud he was of the people in AFSOC and the tremendous job they are doing day in and day out all over the world. The AFA and the ACA hold a combined luncheon like this two or three times a year and people are already looking forward to the next one.

1st SOW Unsung Heroes Luncheon

The Hurlburt Chapter 398 of the AFA has been honoring the "Unsung Heroes" for the past 20 years, and in the fall of every year we honor the Un-sung Heroes of the 1st Special Operations Wing and its Units with a luncheon. This year the chapter recognized 17 "Unsung Heroes" (Airmen who contribute to the mission by always going above and beyond what is expected of them) and honored them at the Hurlburt Soundside Club for lunch on the 3rd of January 2018.

The Hurlburt Honor Guard presented the colors. SSgt Franklin Harvey from the 1st Special Operations Aircraft Maintenance Squadron sang the National Anthem, and Chaplain Jeffery Scott gave the invocation. The Master of Ceremonies for the Luncheon was SSgt Austin Worden from the 4th Special Operations Squadron.



The guest speaker for the lunch was the 1st Special Operations Wing Commander, Col Thomas B. Palenske, and he spoke about Hurlburt field's amazing airmen and had nothing but accolades for our airmen and was so proud and impressed with this group of young Air Commandos. He emphasized that "The Airmen in the 1st Special Operations Wing have been given the authority to make decisions quickly, affect change in their daily lives, and allowed to excel. All the incredible things these brilliant Air Commandos execute on a daily basis are not done by Majors or Lieutenant Colonels; they are done by A1Cs and Senior Airmen." Col Palenske, assisted by 1 SOW Command Chief Wolfe, presented each "Unsung Hero" with a Framed Certificate and a book (donated by MSgt Alex Eudy, 720 STG), written by Admiral (Ret) William McRaven "Spec Ops: Case Studies in Special Operations Warfare." SSgt Worden read a few of each Airman's accomplishments as they came forward. The 2018 edition of the East Panhandle Regional Science and Engineering Fair was held on Wednesday January 31st at the Northwest Florida Fairgrounds. AFA Chapter 398 members Susan Ault-Davis, Fred Gross, Max Friedauer, and Eddie Arroyo volunteered to serve as Special Category Judges for the fair.

AFA was assigned the Computer Science, Engineering, and Human and Machine Cognition categories. The

students were each provided an opportunity to explain the project to the judges. The judges were encouraged to ask questions about the project, the conduct of the project, and the data collection methods used.

There were a wide variety of science projects displayed from a number of categories.

The Chapter annually awards two Senior Division (High School Level) Awards and two Junior Level (Middle School Level) Awards at the Panhandle Fair.

1st Place: Gabe Lerner-Sparrow, Fueling the Future: Hydrogen Production Yield Rate Dependent Upon Aluminum Surface Area


2nd Place: Nolan Eaton, How Caudal Fin Shape Affects the Velocity of a Biologically Inspired Underwater Vessel



Teacher's Workshop

AFA Chapter #398 (Hurlburt) hosted a Teacher STEM workshop on March 10th, 2018. In collaboration with the Doolittle Institute, Inc., the Air Force Research Lab, the Northwest Florida Manufacturers Council, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University Worldwide, and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA), Chapter #398 offered a day of hands-on STEM lessons for teachers.

Twenty teachers from schools across the panhandle (Escambia to Leon counties) gathered at the George McCutchan airport, affectionately termed the McCutchan Intergalactic Spaceport) to engage in what many termed the best workshop they had ever attended. The workshop included lessons on the physics of flight, Bernoulli, and Newton's Laws led by AFRL aeronautical engineer (1Lt.) Michael Dotson. Lt Dotson's presentation



addressed folding paper airplanes, how airplanes fly, numerous paper airplane patterns and activities for the classroom. Lt. Dotson has received several invitations to visit classrooms and make similar presentations. Lessons in robotics were

presented by the folks from the Doolittle Institute, Inc. Robotics lessons including WeDo 2.0 and EV3 robot programming were presented to teachers who were interested in beginning or expanding their classroom robotics offerings. The Embry-Riddle folks had a 3D printer demonstration and an unmanned aerial vehicle / aerial robotics system (UAV/ARS) presentation. The 3D printer was printing out UAV parts for the UAVs that were being flown. Teachers were offered the opportunity to learn to program and pilot small UAVs that will be available for loan to teachers who complete the course. A water rocket activity demonstrated how to use hand pumps, plastic fins, and 2 Liter plastic bottles to launch water rockets. The rocket flight performance was measured by altimeters that recorded



the rocket performance for data collection and review purposes. World champion RC flyer Steve Rojecki demonstrated a variety of UAV systems including the Chapter 398 Yuneec Typhoon UAV. Grilled burgers and soft drinks prepared and served by the Chapter leadership were provided at lunch. The AIAA and other partners donated a variety of items that were used to raffle to the teachers who attended. The only issue was the weather. The gusty winds forced us to cancel the teacher orientation flights.

Chapter 398 coordinated with representatives from Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Walton, and Bay County School districts to allow for the award of professional development credit for teachers who attended the course and completed the follow-on activities.

MajGen McCutchan (USAF, Retired) has already invited the chapter to conduct the spring 2019 STEM workshop at the airport. Mark your calendars. 2018 Scholarships Now Open!

The George and Vicki Muellner Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship program was created through a generous contribution by the George and Vicki Muellner Foundation and designated to assist cadets who are members of either the Arnold Air Society or Silver Wings. Two scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 each will be awarded annually.



Pitsenbarger Awards

Pitsenbarger Awards provide a one-time grant of \$400 to selected top active duty, Guard and Reserve USAF enlisted personnel graduating from the Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) who plan to pursue a baccalaureate degree. The grants coincide with the CCAF graduation ceremonies held each spring and fall.

Colonel Aaron Burgstein Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship program is made possible by a bequest from Mr. and Mrs. Michael and Judith Burgstein, in memory of their devoted son and AFA Lifetime Member, Colonel Aaron Burgstein. The scholarship was established for minor depends of (officer or enlisted) active duty, prior service, or retired service members, reservists or National Guard members of all branches who are/will be pursuing a two year or four year degree at an accredited college/university. Priority will be given to those dependents whose parent/guardian served for eight or more years, has had a parent die while serving on or in an active duty status, or has a parent that has been classified as a wounded warrior through the Air Force Wounded Warrior program. Additional funds supporting this program have been contributed by family, friends and colleagues. One scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 each will be awarded annually.

Captain Jodi Callahan Memorial Scholarship

The Captain Jodi Callahan Memorial Scholarship provides financial assistance and recognition to an active duty Air Force full time guard or reserve (officer or enlisted) person who is pursuing a Master's degree in a non-technical field.

Mike & Gail Donley Spouse Scholarships

The Air Force Association Mike & Gail Donley Spouse Scholarship program is designed to encourage Air Force spouses worldwide to pursue associate/bachelor undergraduate or graduate/postgraduate degrees.

Lt Col Romeo and Josephine Bass Ferretti Scholarship

This scholarship is made possible by a bequest from the estate of Lt Col Romeo and Josephine Bass Ferretti and was established for minor dependents of Air Force active duty, Reserve or Air National Guard enlisted airmen pursuing an undergraduate degree in the area of science, technology, engineering or math (STEM). The recipients will be selected based upon high academic standards, good character and financial need.

Col Loren J. and Mrs. Lawona R. Spencer Scholarship

This scholarship is made possible through a generous endowment from the Spencer estate. It provides funds to United States Air Force Personnel (officer or enlisted, Air Force civilian, full time National Guard and full time Reserve) for them to pursue graduate level education in the management and administration fields in preparation for senior level leadership roles.
