Chapter 398 Treasurer Dann Mattiza and his wife, Jean, recently attended the Florida State JROTC Drill Meet at Osceola High School in Kissimmee, Florida. This was the first Drill meet in several years as the previous 2 or 3 were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Normally, this Annual event is open to various JROTC Drill Teams from throughout Florida and is frequently held at a college or university with an Air Force ROTC unit. In this case, Osceola HS volunteered to host the event and AF ROTC Cadets from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University from Daytona Beach, FL served as judges.

The drill meet was attended by 10 high schools, Bartram Trail, De Land, Miami Southridge, Hernando, Osceola, Celebration and Lake Worth High Schools from Florida, and North Henderson High School from North Carolina. The Drill Meet was held on 4 March and lasted most of the day as Drill Teams and Color Guard units from the various schools competed in Inspection, Regulation Drill, and Exhibition Drill events. At the end of the day, Cadets participated in the Individual Drill Competition to earn individual Awards. Over 40 trophies were awarded to the various schools and teams attending the competition.
